



Our topic is what our speech will be about. You will choose only ONE topic from this list.



Parts of a speech!

- A speech has 3 important parts.
- Introduction
 Ideas
 Conclusion

Introduction

- Our introduction needs a sizzling starti
- That means something exciting that gets everyone wanting to listen.
- Sometimes this is a question or interesting fact about your topic!

Ideas

- The middle of our speech is where we tell our listeners what we know.
 - We can break this up into 2-3 big ideas or reasons to help our speech make sense.

Conclusion

- •Our conclusion helps us end our speech!
 - We can end our speech with something that helps the listeners remember what we spoke about.



 - Put it on paper that you can read from.






Plant Life Cycle





Cut out these blocks to help you complete the activity on the next pages or use some cubes or lego blocks
