
























Manner- Voice

If we are too quiet the audience will not be able to hear our great ideas.




We will also try to make our voice clear by speaking at a normal pace, like we are having a conversation with someone.



If we are too slow or TOO FAST, it will be hard to understand what we are saying and we may not meet our time limit.


































Public Speaking Competition

Manner- Stance





When we are standing in front of the audience we want our speech to be the main focus.



If we are swinging our bodies or playing with our palm cards it could be distracting.

We can stand still or use natural hand gestures that add to our speech.



We can use palm cards that are a good size for our hands to hold and are easy to move.
