### Wanda's Spell Book

To change an adjective to an adverb, just add -ly to the end of the word. For example:

quiet = quietly

#### Except for:

 If the adjective ends in a y, change the 'y' to an 'i' before adding -ly. For example:

sleepy + ly = sleepily

 If the adjective ends in an -able, -ible or -le, change the 'e' to a 'y'. For example:

probable = probably

 If an adjective ends in -ic, just add -ally (except public = publicly).

## Term 3 Week 9

#### Creative & Practical Arts - Drama

Today for our drama lesson we will be exploring the world of toys through improvisation, movement and storytelling.

This means you're going to create and tell a story through some actions and movements without much preparation and that's what we call improvisation.

#### Warm Up Activity

(If you are able to logon to Seesaw please watch the video of Mrs Samra completing the warm up activity then upload your video in the box provided).

For our warm up activity, you need to find a space in a room and you need to move as if you were the following toys:

- A spinning top
- A teddy bear at a picnic that has just woken up from a nap
- A remote-control toy car
- A yoyo

#### Activity-Storytelling

(If you are able to logon to Seesaw please watch the video of Mrs Samra modelling the activity then upload your video in the box provided).

Imagine you have a collection of toys that come to life inside your Magic Toy Box.

1. Pick 1 toy from your Magic Toy Box and introduce yourself in role as the toy chosen and tell the story of how you came to be in the Magic Toy Box

You might tell your story by:

- Telling me who you belong to? What's your story, have you run away from home? Were you lost and couldn't find your way back home
- What are your special features?
- How do you work?
- Why are you an important toy?

#### Conclusion- Improvisation & Freeze Frames

(If you are able to logon to Seesaw please watch the video of Mrs Samra modelling the conclusion and then upload your video in the box provided).

Finally, you will need to improvise so create without much preparation some movements to show me your toy come to life.

Then you will need to stop your action at a random movement and freeze. This is called a FREEZE FRAME. You will be like a frozen picture - THINK OF YOUR BODY LANGUAGE AND FACIAL EXPRESSIONS when you freeze as that will give the audience a good understanding of your toy's personality and background based on the story you just told us earlier.
